The Legacy of John McIntire

In 1802, John McIntire, the leading citizen of Zanesville, was selected as a delegate to Ohio's constitutional convention in Chillicothe. "He participated in the actions that made Ohio a state in 1803," according to his biographer Norris Schneider. McIntire was also the driving force to have Zanesville named Ohio's capital (1810-1812). After leading the effort to construct the Y-Bridge, according to Schneider, "On January 27, 1814, McIntire and his associates organized the Zanesville Canal and Manufacturing Company to dig a canal, build a dam, and exploit the water power of the falls. This company, with functions legally altered, still exists today as the trustee of the McIntire Estate."

Born in 1759 in Virginia and apprenticed to a cobbler as a youth due to a leg problem that made him unable to do strenuous work, McIntire migrated to Wheeling in 1779. His hand was crippled during the defense of Wheeling's Fort Henry in the Revolutionary War. In 1798, McIntire moved from Wheeling to the Ohio Territory after assisting his father-in-law, Colonel Ebenezer Zane, cut the Zane Trace from Wheeling to Maysville, Kentucky. As payment for creating this path that opened Ohio to cross country travel, Zane received 640 acres at the points where the Trace crossed the Muskingum, Hocking, and Scioto Rivers. Zane sold the 640 acres that formed Westbourne (which became Zanesville in 1804) to his brother Jonathan Zane and John McIntire for \$100. McIntire soon bought Jonathan's share.

McIntire was the father of Amelia, who was born on June 8, 1800, to Lyddy Zane, his wife Sarah's cousin. Lyddy was McIntire's housekeeper in the Ohio Territory while Sarah remained in Wheeling. Upon arriving in Zanesville, Sarah forgave McIntire and raised Amelia, the only child born to McIntire, as her own.

McIntire, known as the "Father of Zanesville," died on July 29, 1815, at the age of 56. When his daughter Amelia died in 1820 without an heir, her share of dividends became available "for the use and support of a poor school," as specified by McIntire in his will. Since he felt that his greatest handicap was his lack of education, he made provisions for others from poor families to attend school. In 1854, after the death of Sarah McIntire, the real estate held by the Zanesville Canal and Manufacturing Company was to be sold to increase the assets available for charitable purposes. And, after public schools were established, the McIntire Fund provided a library, a park, a children's home, and college scholarships.

John McIntire's fund is the largest scholarship fund in Appalachian Ohio. With assets of more than \$10 million, the fund furnishes more than \$500,000 in scholarships each year "for the poor youth of Zanesville." Through his well-written will, John McIntire, with the Zanesville Canal and Manufacturing Company as Trustee, continues to have a profound affect upon those who live in his city 200 years after he assisted in the creation of the State of Ohio.

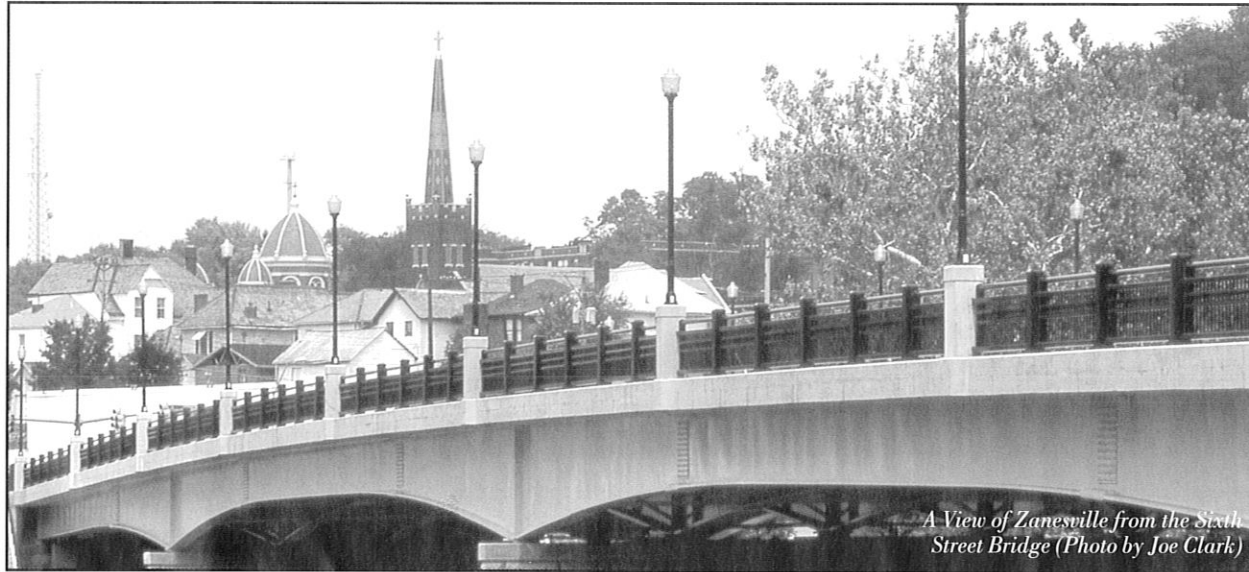

A Message from the President



Reflecting on our past...

Dear Foundation Family and Friends,

On February 2, 1803, President Thomas Jefferson signed a bill that proclaimed the **State of Ohio** the nation's 17th state. We, the **MUSKINGUM COUNTY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION**, salute Ohio on the occasion of its bicentennial.

Perhaps the most significant occurrence in Ohio history relative to the Foundation was in 1870 when the State of Ohio chartered **John D. Rockefeller's** Standard Oil Company. He organized a "trust" (an arrangement whereby a group manages property on another's behalf). It was a practice replicated worldwide and set up the framework for community foundations. The first of which was the Cleveland Foundation founded in 1914 by the President of the Cleveland Trust Company, **Frederick Goff**. Today there are more than 650 community foundations in the United States (77 in Ohio). **The Muskingum County Community Foundation**, incorporated in **1985**, has given approximately \$3,984,500 in grants to improve the quality of life in our region. **Our donors are the Heart of it All!**

In 2002 and 2003, we welcomed new board members **Kristy Szemetylo, Carl Raines, Dean Young, Jeff Beam, and Tom Selock**. The Foundation Board of Trustees adopted a personnel policy manual and strengthened our capacity to prudently manage funds by hiring an independent fund management group to analyze our investment practices. The Foundation was entrusted with seventeen new funds bringing the total permanent funds to 193. By year-end, our asset market value was \$10,800,000, and we had granted \$380,200 to local charities.

Looking to our future...

At the strategic planning session at the Schultz Mansion on October 8, 2002, Trustees and Friends of the Foundation resolved to:

- Preserve the seven strategic goals established for the period 2001 – 2005 (listed on pages 7-9);
- Develop annual objectives for staff corresponding with the long term strategic goals;
- Achieve 100% Board participation in LEAVE A LEGACY® by 2004;
- Enhance our efficiency with computer upgrades and electronic mail; and,
- Strengthen partnerships with community grantmakers.

Partnerships are where we are headed. Aligning the resources of charitable individuals and organizations toward common projects is our future. The fascinating things people want to do to enhance our neighborhoods and strengthen our families are inspiring. It is the position of the Foundation that convening partnerships is the smart way to get things accomplished – both to coordinate planning and to leverage support. In some ways, it means rethinking how we relate to one another. For example, my parents and I recently broadened our lifelong connection by becoming donor partners. Partnering in grantmaking is a maturing process, and our community is seasoned for it. Foundations, associations, service clubs, churches, governments, and corporations all have dreams, funds, leaders, and community interdependence. **In our future, let us identify common interests and work together to do greater things** than can be accomplished individually.

I extend my special thanks to the **Trustees** and **Trustees Emeriti**, the **Foundation Council**, the **Community Youth Foundation**, and **our staff** for tremendous leadership and dedication. You are invited to review the projects and events to which we devoted our attention this past year in this 2002 annual report.

A Message from the Executive Director



Dear Friends,

This past year (2002) was a year of good projects and new possibilities. Among the high points of the year were the following:

President Doug Mock handed the gavel over to the Foundation's sixth president, **James McDonald**, at our spring Board of Trustees meeting. The projects that began during Doug's service as president are reaching completion or experiencing expansion under the leadership of James McDonald. In addition, James is implementing his Community Grantmaking agenda in which donors will choose projects and work in collaboration with the Foundation.

The Putnam Underground Railroad Education Center (PURE) construction was completed under the fine guidance of **Ray Thomas**. Funding is currently being sought for the computer equipment and furniture. The PURE Center is in need of period furniture and artifacts from the time of the abolitionists in Putnam.

Our **Scholarship Central** program received the **Thomas L. Conlan Award for Excellence** from the **KnowledgeWorks Foundation** as the best College Access Program in the State of Ohio. **Bill Straker's** idea has become a great asset to our community. **Anna Oertel**, who formerly directed the program, is now with *The Times Recorder*. The new coordinator is **Joey Pennybaker**, now **Mrs. Sam (Joey) Osborn**.

On September 5, 2002, Rudy Giuliani, the former mayor of the City of New York, was the featured speaker at the Longaberger Legacy Dinner at the new home of **Tami Longaberger and Todd Fitz at Eschman Meadows**. This event was a benefit for the three community foundations serving Coshocton, Licking, and Muskingum Counties. Our Foundation received nearly \$70,000 from the ticket sales. The legendary Longaberger benevolence again shone upon this extraordinary occasion.

On October 4, 2002, the Foundation was visited by **Governor Bob Taft** who enjoyed the visit so much that he stayed well beyond the time originally scheduled. Our entire Foundation family was honored by his visit.

The publication of *Artistry, Community, and Legacy*, the book about **Ray Thomas and his community**, was celebrated at a party sponsored and hosted by Ray at his impressive home in Stonehenge. Many of Zanesville's finest citizens are pictured and profiled in the book which is available from the Community Foundation and from local service clubs.


With activities focused on future grantmakers in our community, the **Community Youth Foundation (CYF)** has gained new funding

through **Ann Day's** grant writing efforts. **Ward Kieffer Mitzel**, President of the CYF, received the first **Ohio Youth Grantmaking Network 2003 Youth Action Award**, recognizing his efforts as the leader of our Foundation's young grantmakers. I am proud of his achievements as any father would be of a son who cares about his community.

Finally, the **LEAVE A LEGACY®** program is now a program of the new **Muskingum Planned Giving Council** whose officers are **Don Wietmarschen**, President; **Jack McClelland**, Treasurer; and **Bruce Lee**, Secretary. The LEAVE A LEGACY program is a national initiative that encourages *everyone* to make provisions for charity in their estate plans. More than 64 local organizations have joined in support of this effort initially funded jointly by the **Community Foundation** and **Genesis Healthcare Foundation**.

As always, I encourage each of you to leave your legacy **A**to your favorite charities in our community either directly or through the establishment of an endowment fund in the Community Foundation. We all need "to plant shade trees under which we know full well we will never sit."

The Thomas Community Service Award 2002

The Thomas Community Service Award is named after Raymond W. Thomas, the Founding President of the Muskingum County Community Foundation. The Award is given to outstanding individuals who have donated their time and talents to improve the quality of life in Muskingum County. These volunteers have been instrumental in the success of a particular organization or community project. Each Thomas Award recipient has a \$1,000 donation made in his or her name to the organization he or she has benefited. In 2002, three exemplary volunteers were honored for their good works in the community: Bob Grayson, Tim Hartmeyer, and Franklin "Fritz" Thomas.

Tim Hartmeyer for the Police Athletic League (PAL)

Tim Hartmeyer is a Muskingum County Sheriff's Deputy who devotes his off-duty hours to the Police Athletic League (PAL) program. This program is designed to attract underprivileged youth who train and box under the guidance of Tim and other volunteers. The

PAL program is as much mental as physical. The young people in PAL are being mentored and shown proper behavior and citizenship, as well as developing their boxing skills. Mentoring not only takes place at the Pine Street PAL facility, but also at Tim's home where he invites the youth and their parents to picnic, swim, play games, and socialize. For the youth who lack parental guidance, Tim meets with school officials one-on-one to discuss any concerns with the PAL youth.

Award recipients will be honored at the Donor Recognition & Awards Banquet (sponsored by First Federal) at the Zanesville Country Club on April 30th. Invitations to the Banquet are extended to donors of \$1,000 or more to the Foundation's Unrestricted Fund during 2003.

Bob Grayson for the Munson Arts Task Force

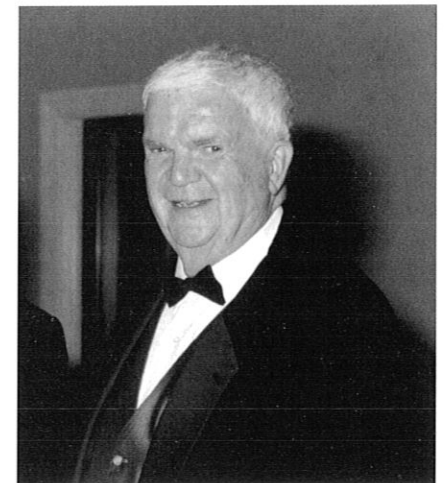

The Task Force helps children to fulfill their dreams and aspirations and reach their full potential through the arts. This program is but one recent manifestation of Bob's service as he has dedicated his life to being an advocate for children and youth. Through his involvement in Pro-Muskingum, he established a community education program at an inner city school. Our Seven Strategic Goals

January 1, 2001 - December 31, 2005

Goal One

The assets of the Foundation will increase to \$25,000,000 by December 31, 2005.

Rationale: On September 30, 2000, the net assets of the Foundation were nearly \$13,000,000. The Foundation has doubled its assets from December 31, 1996, when its assets were approximately \$6,500,000. The Foundation will again attempt to double its assets in the upcoming five-year period.

Strategy: Without a major gifts campaign, the goal of \$25,000,000 can only be achieved with an on-going and intensive marketing campaign and additional funding generated by grant writing to obtain external support from public and private sources.

Goal Two

The Foundation will record \$25,000,000 in documented planned gifts by December 31, 2005.

Rationale: The Community Foundation is becoming more well-known and respected. Many older individuals, in transferring wealth to the next generation, are making provisions for charitable causes that they wish to support beyond their lifetimes.

Strategy: The Foundation will take the lead in the establishment of a LEAVE A LEGACY® program that will be a cooperative effort among professional advisers, fund raising executives, and area non-profit organizations. Its goal will be to increase the number and the size of planned gifts to the community and to the Foundation through an intensive and ongoing marketing campaign.

Goal Three

The annual operating costs of the Foundation will be paid by the earnings from the Foundation's Operating Endowments; from fees charged to component funds of the Foundation; and from sponsorships of the Foundation's publications, advertising, events, and programs by December 31, 2005.

Rationale: The intent of the originators of the Foundation was to create an endowment fund that would generate sufficient income to pay the operating expenses of the Foundation. Although the recent major gifts campaign increased the operating endowment fund to more than \$2,000,000, additional funds are needed.

Strategy: The Foundation board and staff will work with professional advisers and planned giving prospects to convince them of the importance of providing a portion of their gifts to the operating endowment fund. In addition, the Foundation will actively engage sponsors for long-term commitments of sponsorship of the Annual Report, newsletters and brochures, the LEAVE A LEGACY® program, the Annual Leadership Lecture, web-site and web-based giving maintenance, and both the Groundhog Day and other events.



Our Seven Strategic Goals (continued)

Goal Four

The Foundation will consistently and persistently market itself as the vehicle to be used to achieve each donor's dreams for our community. The Foundation has identified areas of needed community improvements to focus its grantmaking upon over the next five years. The following areas may be supplemented by additional dreams that donors want to achieve:

- Property Development - The Foundation will work to improve the appearance of downtown, the route 40 corridor into and out of town, and the Putnam area.
- Educational Programs - The Foundation will support educational programs that promote literacy, that enhance achievement by students in all disciplines, and that focus students upon positive choices that further their educational and career goals.
- Scholarship Assistance - The Foundation will assist all students in Zanesville and Muskingum County to gain financial resources for post secondary education. The establishment of a one-stop center for scholarships and financial aid for higher education is one strategy to achieve this goal.
- Health Care for the Uninsured - The Foundation will assist the efforts of public and private health care providers, physicians, and other interested parties in providing access to a free or low-fee medical clinic.
- Community Leadership Development - The Foundation will cooperate with the Chamber of Commerce and others interested in developing the current and next generations of leaders of our community.
- A Regional Association of Grantmakers - The Foundation will convene area grantmakers to exchange information about regional needs, to discuss collaboration on charitable projects, and to listen to the needs of grantseekers.
- Values - The Foundation will support efforts to promote positive values in families and in the community. Among these values are mutual respect, civility, a strong work ethic, and a shared responsibility for our common destiny.
- Culture - The Foundation will support efforts to enrich the cultural life of our community and to ensure that the visual and performing arts touch the lives of every child and every adult in our community.

Rationale: The Foundation is a vehicle for donors to realize their dreams for the community. Donors are encouraged, through their giving, to help address the issues, including those listed above, that will improve our community's quality of life.

Strategy: The role of the Foundation is to act as convener and catalyst in gathering people and resources to address significant issues in our community. The above issues will be the focus of grant competitions from unrestricted funds for the next five years.

Goal Five

Within five years, the Foundation, through the efforts of the Foundation Council will more than double the number of donors to its funds from the current level of 1,200 to 2,500.

Rationale: The Foundation is a community foundation in name only if it does not gain widespread recognition and support of its mission of improving the quality of life of our community. The best measure of the Foundation's impact in the community is in the number of individuals who voluntarily contribute to its component funds and projects.

Strategy: Market. Market. Market. The more people who are reached by the media and personal contact, who are involved in our special events, and who are involved in community projects sponsored or convened by the Foundation, the greater is our donor base.

Goal Six

The Foundation Council will establish and manage an active Community Youth Foundation involving youth from all high schools in Muskingum County and Zanesville.

Rationale: The future of our community is dependent upon the quality of our human assets as well as upon the assets that the Foundation builds in its various funds. Involvement of high school students as Directors of a Community Youth Foundation will provide them with service on a board with full responsibility for investing, managing, and distributing funds to improve the quality of life for young people in our community.

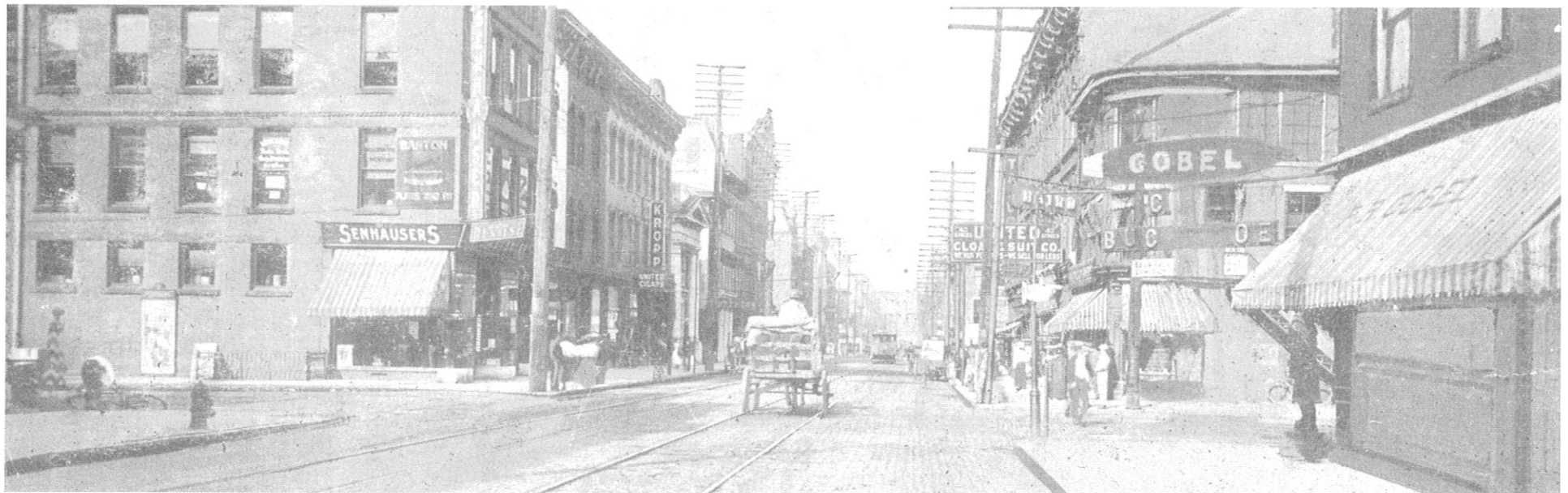
Strategy: The Foundation Council will select students from each high school in Zanesville and Muskingum County for the Community Youth Foundation Board and will work with them.

Goal Seven

The Foundation's investment performance will remain in the top half of community foundations of comparable size in the annual survey conducted by The Council on Foundations through the year 2005.

Rationale: The investment performance of the Foundation becomes more critical to the success of its mission as the Foundation gains more assets.

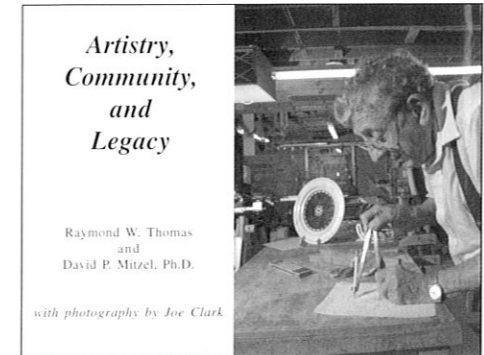
Strategy: The Investment Committee and the Board as a whole will be encouraged to become involved in devising approaches that will maximize the return on our investments while avoiding unnecessary risk. The Investment Committee will set high standards of performance and closely monitor managers of the Foundation's funds to avoid duplication, unnecessary risk, and deviation from style.

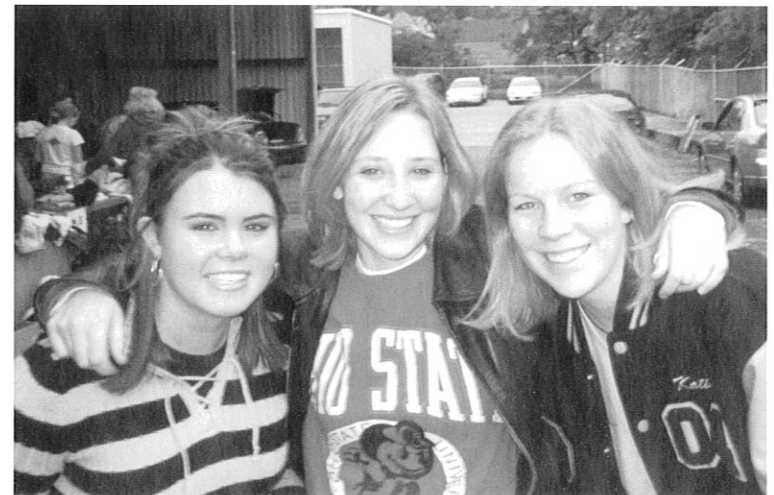

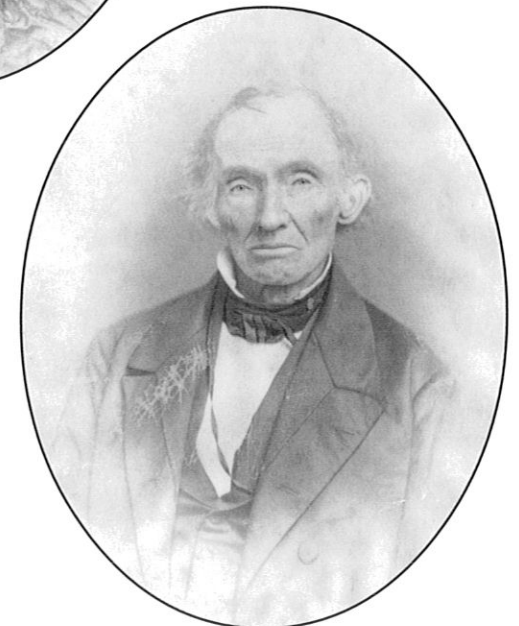

Alvah Buckingham was born in Ballston, New York, in 1791. Alvah moved to Zanesville in 1812 to help his brother Ebenezer with his growing construction business. On October 3, 1819, Alva married Ann Hale of Glastonbury, Connecticut, and built their house on the corner of Moxahala Avenue and Adams Street in Putnam.

Alvah and Ann had five children, Benjamin, Philo, James, Elizabeth, and Julia. Julia married Zanesville native, Samuel Cox, in 1849. Samuel became the editor of the Democratic “Ohio Daily Statesman” in Columbus. He was elected to four terms in Congress. Under President Grover Cleveland, Samuel served as Minister to Turkey.

In 1832, the firm of E. Buckingham, Jr., and Company was dissolved by the sudden death of Ebenezer. The Company continued to grow under the name of Buckingham and Company. Alvah was known for his construction of bridges, grain elevators, and homes.

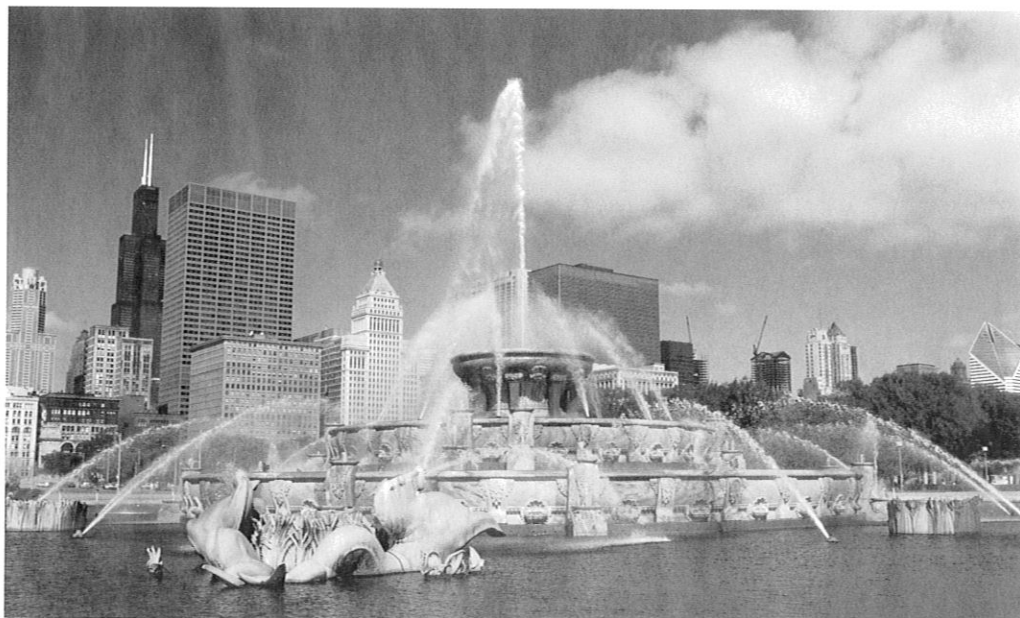
In 1851, Alvah Buckingham’s oldest son, Benjamin, and his partner, William Sturges, built the first grain elevator in Chicago. In 1854, Alvah concluded a contract with the Illinois Central Railroad for warehousing all of their grain business for ten years. In 1858, Alvah moved his family to Chicago. In 1865, he moved to New York to be near his two daughters. On October 4, 1867 — eleven days after the death of his wife — Alvah died. Both are buried in Woodlawn Cemetery. Much of the family’s wealth moved to New York and

Chicago: only the Buckingham’s youngest son, James, remained in Muskingum County.

Written of Alvah in the 1882 History of Muskingum County: “He came to this place in 1812, to assist his brother, Ebenezer, and with him subsequently engaged in mercantile pursuits, in which, while he was eminently successful, he acquired an enviable reputation for integrity.”



The magnificent Clarence Buckingham Memorial Fountain, located by Lake Michigan in Grant Park, Chicago, Illinois, was the world’s largest fountain when it was built in 1927. This famous landmark, built by Kate Buckingham in memory of her brother, is one of the nation’s finest fountains. **Wouldn’t it have been wonderful to have this beautiful fountain in Zanesville?** The Buckingham family gained its initial success in Zanesville, Ohio, with river transport, grain elevator construction, and grain storage businesses. Both the Alvah and Ebenezer Buckingham homes are still among the most impressive homes in the Putnam Historic District of Zanesville.

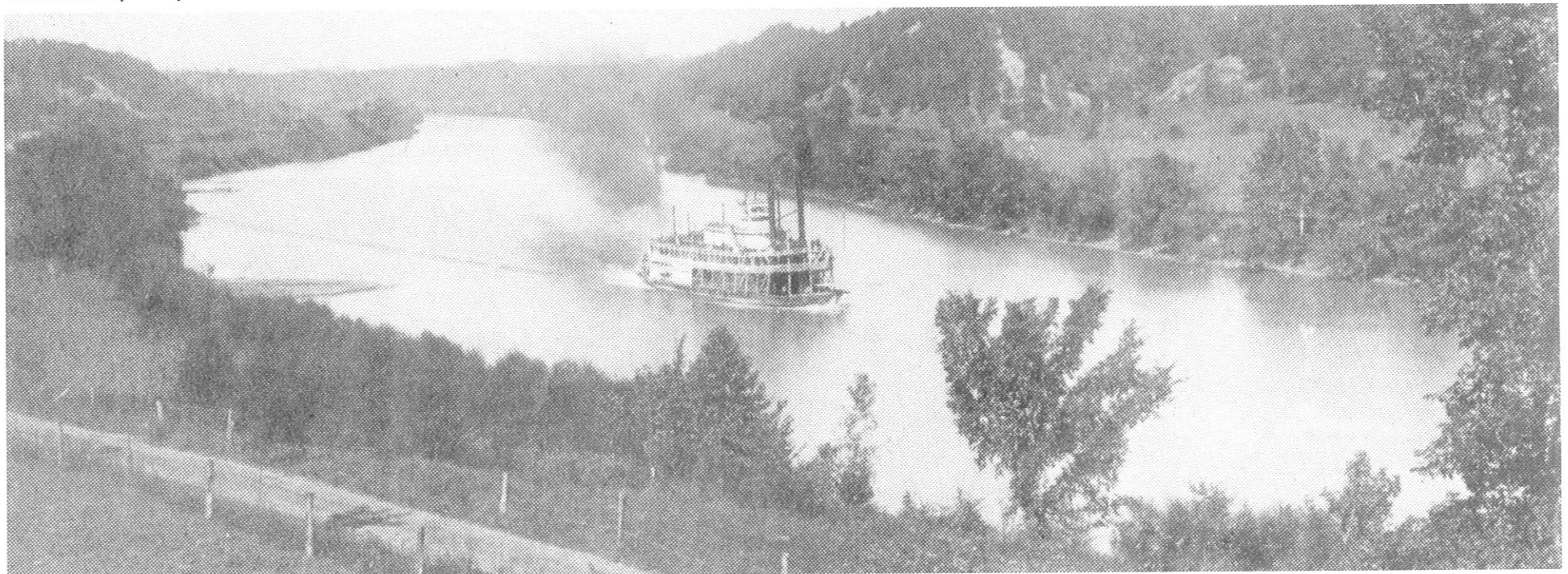

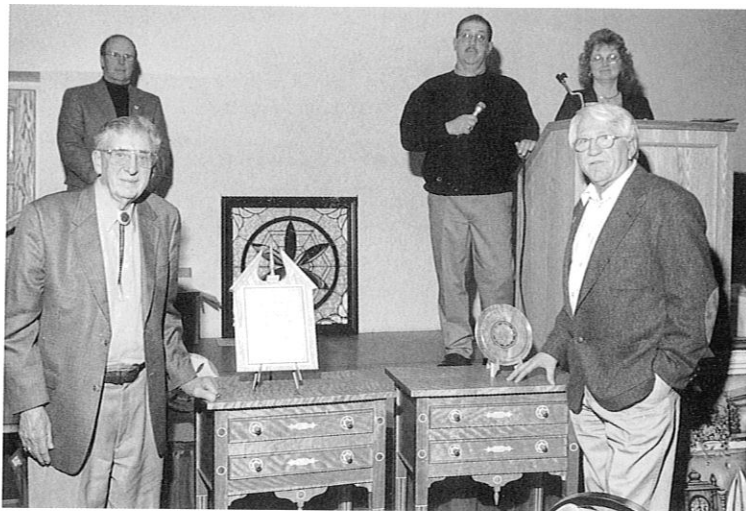
In 2002, awards in grant competitions totaled \$58,637 and ranged from \$220 to \$6,000 for various projects and programs in Muskingum County. Both unrestricted and restricted grant awards totaled \$380,200 in 2002.

Nonprofit organizations and community groups in Muskingum County are invited to apply for grants. When awarding grants, we look for organizations and projects that help build a healthy community. Improving the quality of life in Muskingum County is the primary goal of the Foundation's grant making.

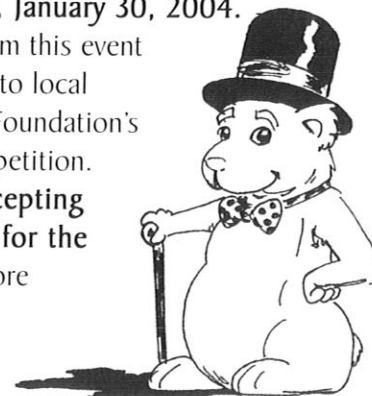

The Dick Johnson Civic Leadership Award 2002

The first person honored by this award was the person whose name it bears: Dick Johnson. The three attributes are the following:

First, the Award recognizes success as an entrepreneur, as a businessperson in Muskingum County.

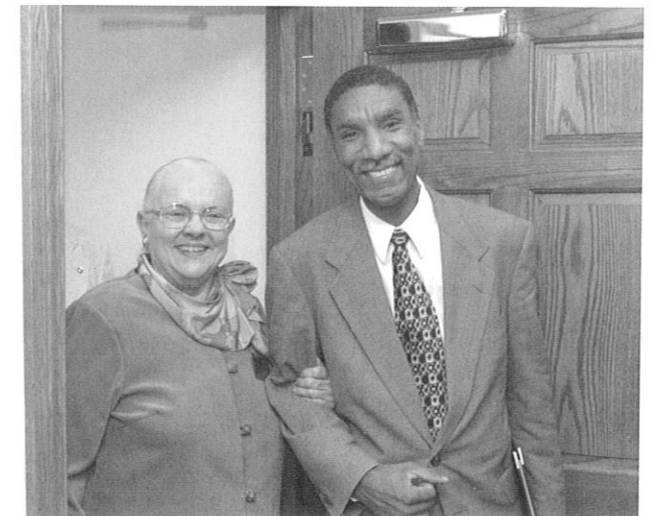

Financials

January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002

The Foundation owns property and equipment, pledges receivable, and life insurance policies. Grants are generally made from earnings on endowment funds, which are designated to grow the principal of the fund by spending only interest and dividends. Most of the Foundation's component funds are endowments established to benefit local charities. While approximately 40% of the Foundation's endowment funds are designated or field of interest funds, an additional 13% are used to provide scholarships for Muskingum County residents. Approximately 11% of these endowed funds were established to benefit the Foundation, to ensure it will be here forever to continually benefit our community.



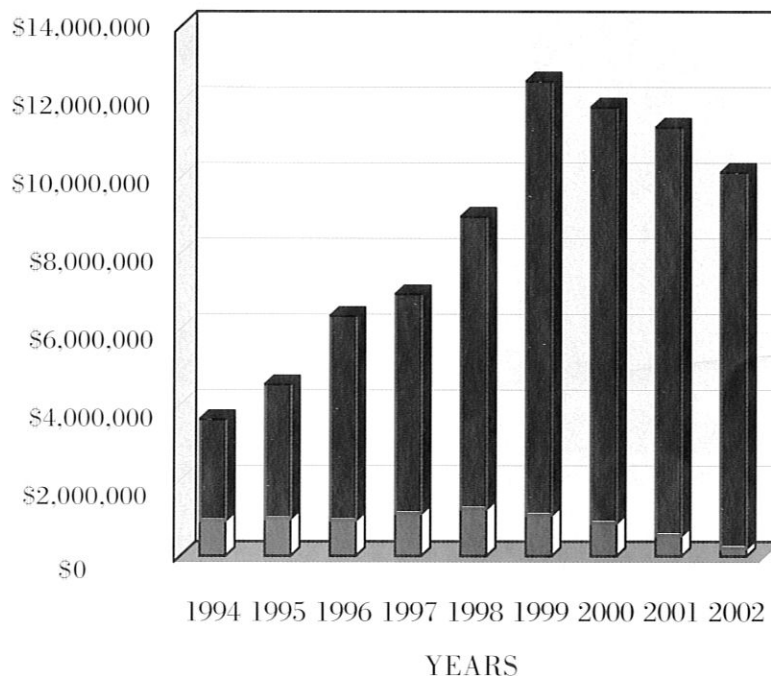
Donors are given many choices when giving to charity through the Foundation. Donors may:

1994-2002**

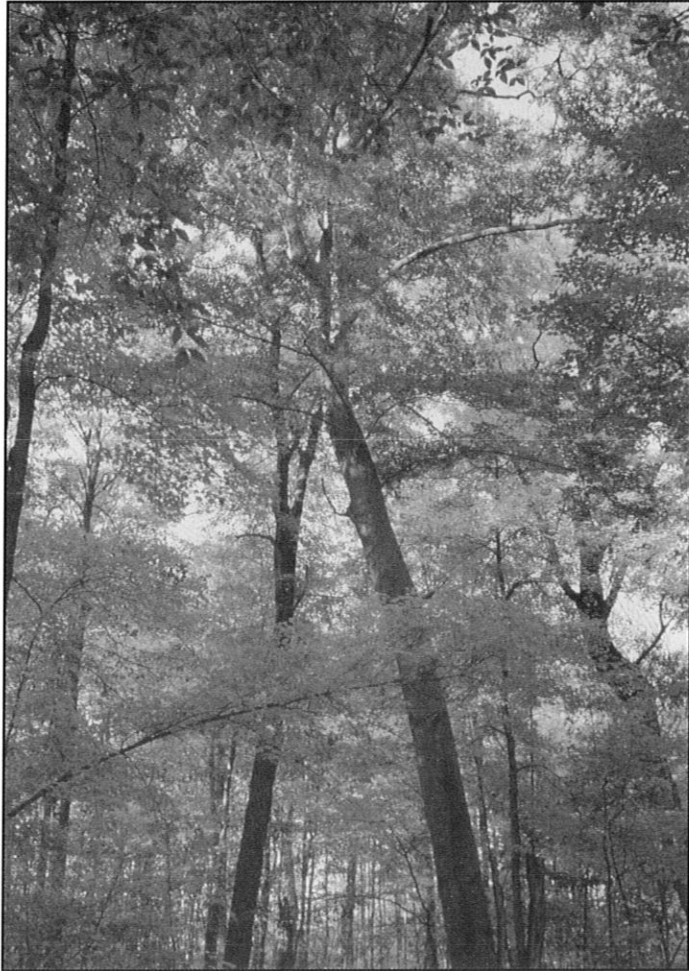

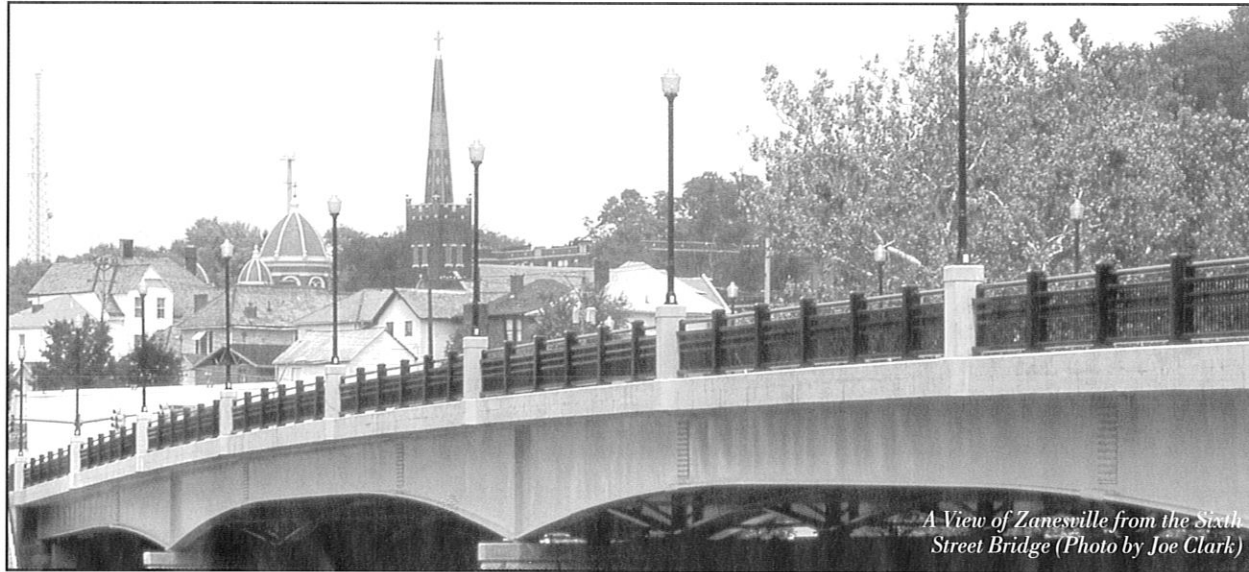
